

Update from CVMA Delegate

A tidbit from the CVMA delegates meeting that was in January.

Start early with your license renewal using the BreEZe system! This year the fingerprint requirement will be in play. You can review the requirement at **vmb.ca.gov**. Look under Announcements, then clarifications. You can upload livescan from the CVMA.net website.

The take home message is that if your info from the form that you fill out for the fingerprint requirement and take to the live scan provider doesn't exactly match your renewal form then you can get "pending message" from the VMB. It will get stuck there and the VMB is so far behind and understaffed that you will have trouble getting it un stuck. The difficulty can arise with hyphenated last names etc.

****KEEP YOUR RECEIPT AND COPY OF RENEWAL FORM****

It is legal for you to continue practicing until it is straightened out, but you must keep the proof. If after submitting it says pending for more than a couple of days you have a problem. Good luck.



Look Like a Wizard: Lifting the Spell on Orthopedic Evaluations and Canine Movement
